Selection Criteria Eligible Candidates:

The full scholarships are available for professionals working for the government, (semi) governmental organisations, think tanks addressing WMD concerns, national export control bodies, national authorities for the (implementation of) the CWC (and BWC), national nuclear (energy) agencies and research centres in related disciplines. The applicants are key figures capable of delivering a valuable contribution to the disarmament and non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and are in a position to implement the newly gained knowledge and insights in their respective organisations.

Specific criteria for a full scholarship:

Full scholarships are available for professionals with excellent proven English. They should be a national of, and living and working in, at least one of the countries from the categories *low-income economies* and *lower-middle-income economies* according to The World Bank. Please check the separate document on our website to see the eligible countries for the WMD scholarships 2017.

The full scholarships cover:

- Tuition fees including study materials;
- International air travel to and from the Netherlands (economy up to a max. of €1100);
- Hotel accommodation (max. of 6 nights);
- Local travel allowance;
- Basic medical insurance;
- A daily subsistence allowance to cover food expenses;
- Administration fees for the application, selection and logistics per candidate.

Application documents to be submitted:

The scholarships will be awarded on academic and professional merit. When applying for the summer programme, applicants must submit:

- A completed online scholarship application form to be found here;
- A curriculum vitae;
- A letter of motivation (350-500 words), including argument for scholarship eligibility;
- One signed letter of recommendation from your current employer.

The deadline for application is 23 July 2017

Selection Method:

Scholarship applications will be reviewed by a panel of professionals from the Asser Institute and OPCW. Scholarship recipients will be notified by the end of July 2017. The decision will be non-negotiable.
