On 24 June 2011, Tunisia acceded to the *Rome Statute*. The Accession was decided through a Presidential Decree dated 19 February 2011. The deposit of the instrument of accession was delayed to ensure that Tunisia advanced its process of ratification of the Agreement on Privileges and Immunities of the Court (APIC) and of the amendments to the *Rome Statute* adopted in June 2010 by the Kampala Review Conference concerning the crime of aggression and the use of some prohibited weapons as a war crime.
