Human rights research encompasses many different fields and types of research questions and methods. Moreover, it is a field of research where many different disciplines come together. For this reason, and to ensure the quality of the work we produce, a number of steps have to be taken once the research question has been articulated. First, we need to clarify the type of question (normative vs empirical, purely legal vs interdisciplinary). Second, what consequences does this have for the type of research you can and cannot do? And lastly, foundational rules of the field may limit the type of analysis you can use. For example, for international human rights law, analysis of international legal provisions has to adhere to legal rules of interpretation, notably the VCLT.

To help you in deciding on the appropriate methodology, Prof. Fons Coomans will introduce you to the fundamental methodological concerns, followed by Dr. Andrea Broderick who summarize the use of the VCLT in your PhD. Dr. André Nunes Chaib in turn will introduce participants to empirical research methods, in particular qualitative empirical research. Afterwards there will be the opportunity to ask questions in the group.
