Registered Attorney at law in the Hungarian Bar Association since 2001-. Legal Adviser in the Legal Service of the Council of the EU since April 2006-/after winning an AD 12 Head of Unit EPSO concurs in 2005/, specialised in general international law including *inter alia* international humanitarian law, international human rights law and in EU external relations' law.
